Status Report to be filed before the Hon'ble High Court of Madras in W.P.(C) No. 7284 of 2021 filed by Ms. S.Sushma & Anr.Vs. Commissioner of Police

Based on the recommendations of the aforementioned Expert Committee in meetings dated 29.09.2021, 04.10.2021 05.10.2021, an Advisory dated 13.10.2021 was issued by the Medical Commission, requesting universities/Colleges/ Institutions that while teaching UG & PG students wherever the issue of gender or similar kind arise, the mention of Clinical history or complaints or signs/symptoms, examination findings or history about nomenclature shall not be taught in such a way that it becomes/perceived in any way derogatory/discriminatory/insulting LGBTQIA+ to Further all the authors of Medical Text Books were instructed to amend the information about virginity, LGBTQIA+ Community and homosexuals etc. in their textbooks according to the available scientific literature, guidelines issued by the Government and directions passed by the Government and directions passed by the Hon'ble Courts and Medical universities/colleges/Institutions were also requested not to approve the books as recommended books by the University if the books have unscientific, derogatory and discriminatory information about virginity, LGBTQIA+ Community and homosexuals. A status report to the above effect enclosing the Advisory dated 13.10.2021 issued by the National Medical Commission had been filed on 15.11.2021before the Hon'ble Court and the same was considered and taken on record by the Hon'ble Court in the hearing dated 06.12.2021. The Hon'ble High Court of Madras was pleased to direct as under:

"At this point, the learned counsel appearing on behalf of the Petitioners submitted that the existing competencies of CBME-Curriculum carries offensive and unscientific terms about the LGBTQIA+ community and submitted that if the NMC amends the said competencies listed in their handbook, the authors of medical text books will automatically be obliged to revise their publications accordingly. The learned counsel further submitted a chart highlighting



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the objectionable terms employed in the competencies of CBME-Curriculum with specific reference to aspects on LGBTQIA+ and virginity, along with suggestions for modification of the said competencies. This chart, the counsel brought to the notice of this Court, was prepared upon their consultation with a number of doctors and professionals in the field of medicine. It will be useful to extract the chart hereunder, and the NMC is directed to give serious consideration to the suggestions made therein and their status report to be filed on the next hearing shall include their justification, if any, on the same......"

2. That in pursuance to the order dated 06.12.2021 and another order dated 23.12.2021 passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Madras in the matter, UGMEB formed an Expert Committee under the Chairmanship of Dr. Vijayendra Kumar, Member(UGMEB) vide office order dated 03.01.2022 to address the issues/suggestions raised by the Petitioner mentioned at Para 11 of the Court order dated 06.12.2021:

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constituted by NMC suggested modifications in the competencies (CBME) of Forensic Medicine subject no. FM 3.16, FM 3.13, FM 3.17, FM 3.18 and competencies of psychiatric subject no. PS 13.1 to 13.7) as mentioned in the table below. That while studying the UG competency based curriculum, the committee found that there are other competencies in medical curriculum related to LGBTQIA+community and other sexual issues which require modifications hence the same were also discussed in the meeting:

- 4. That in addition to the discussion on Forensic Medicine Competency and Psychiatry Competency in the meeting, several other suggestions were received from the expert committee members regarding similar and incidental issues and the same were discussed in the meeting. They are categorically mentioned hereunder:
 - a. Terminology "Gender identity disorder" used in PG competency-based curriculum;
 - b. Regarding Conversion therapy;
 - c. Regarding Conversion therapy & medical curriculum;
- 5. That regarding term "Gender Identity Disorder" used in PG Competency-based curriculum, it has been decided that the said terminology will be replaced by term "Gender dysphoria".
- 6. That in pursuance to the direction by the Hon'ble Court for prohibiting any attempts to medically "cure" or change the sexual orientation of LGBTIQA+ people to heterosexual or the gender identity of transgender people to cisgender and to take action against the concerned professional involving themselves in any form or method of conversion "therapy", including withdrawal of license to practice, the committee is of the view that all Interventions to "change" sexual orientation of a person (commonly referred as Conversion therapy)—Should be banned. In this regard, Committee further submitted that



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in order to execute the aforesaid action, the Professional Conduct, Etiquette and Ethics Regulations of NMC needs to be accordingly amended and in furtherance of that instructions/ notification needs to be issued.

- Further it was suggested that any attempt/ interventions (commonly referred to as Conversion therapy) to "change" sexual orientation of а person to heterosexual shall constitute **PROFESSIONAL** MISCONDUCT on the part of the medical professionals under chapter 7 of the Indian Medical Council (Professional Conduct, Etiquette and Ethics) Regulation, 2002. Hence, necessary official notification in this regard needs to be issued.
- 8. In PG Psychiatry Curriculum there is need to have module on empathic understanding of psychological issues among LGBTQIA+ groups and an emphasis that any form of conversion therapy is unethical.
- 9. In the view of the order dated 06.12.2021 and subsequent order dated 23.12.2021 passed by the Hon'ble High Court, the matter alongwith the minutes of the Expert Committee was considered by UGMEB, NMC and it has been opined that the suggestions given by the petitioners as mentioned at Para-11 of the order dated 06.12.2021, has been considered in the meetings of the Expert Committee held in the month of January 2022. Copies of the minutes of the meetings dated 13.01.2022 and 19.01.2022 are attached herewith as **Annexure-I**. The **suggestions/observations** made by Expert Committee pertaining to changes needed in competencies of CBME curriculum are also enclosed herewith as **Annexure-II**.
- 10. That the abovementioned suggestions made by he Expert Committee have already been communicated to the National Medical Commission (NMC) and to all the concerned autonomous boards under NMC i.e. Under Graduate Medical Education Board (UGMEB), Post Graduate Medical Education Board (PGMEB), Ethics and Medical Education Board (EMRB) for taking appropriate action. The

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letter circulated to NMC and all the above-mentioned autonomous boards are enclosed herewith as **Annexure-III.**

11. This has the approval of the President, UGMEB, National Medical Commission.

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Psychiatry. Keeping in view all these points, it was decided to invite President, PGMEB, Member PGMEB and President, MARB, Dr. Gangadhar. He was also the Director of NIMHANS, Bengaluru.

4. Dr. Khandekar would share the modified competencies with the committee members by 14.01.22. These modifications would be shared with the National Medical Commission by Dr. Vijayendra Kumar, Chairman of the Committee. NMC would then issue notifications accordingly.

- After an extensive discussion, it was decided that there was a need to change the competencies related to LGBTQI+A in PG and UG Competency based Curriculum. Dr Chandra and Dr Khandekar modified the competencies and shared with the committee. The modifications were approved by all.
- 2. After extensive discussion on conversion therapy, the committee members also shared their recommendations about conversion therapy in its report for further necessary action.



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3. It was also discussed that there is a need to change the word "gender identity disorder" in PG curriculum with appropriate words. These recommendations shall be sent to the PG Board for approval. After approval has been sought for all modified competencies and recommendations from all Expert committee members. The same shall be given to NMC which can later issue notifications regarding same.

The minutes were unanimously approved by all.

Report of the Expert Committee constituted by NMC to address the issues of LGBTQIA + community and Virginity in Competency Based Medical Education- CBME- Curriculum

- 1. Hon'ble Justice N. Anand Venkatesh of Madras High Court in in W.P.No.7284 of 2021 titled MS. S. SUSHMA &Anr Vs The Commissioner of Police &Ors has pointed out certain vital changes that are required in the CBME curriculum.
- 2. Pursuant to the orders passed by the Hon'ble High Court, the NMC Undergraduate Medical Education Board, through Office Order dt.24.09.2021, constituted an Expert Committee to address these issues in the MBBS course curriculum. The expert committee consisted of following members:
 - a. Dr. Vijendra Kumar, Member, UGMEB, NMC & Chairman of the Committee.
 - Dr. Prabha Chandra, Senior Professor, Psychiatry, NIMHANS & Member, UGMEB.
 - Dr. Surekha Kishore, Executive Director, AIIMS, Gorakhpur & Member, UGMEB, NMC &
 - Dr Indrajit Khandekar, Professor, Forensic Medicine, MGIMS, Sevagram.
- 3. The committee was directed to specifically focus on the following two issues and provide for their recommendations:-
 - Virginity Test in the Forensic Medicine Curriculum of MBBS; and
 - Modifications related to LGBTQIA+ community in MBBS.
- 4. The said expert committee was again reconstituted by NMC by order dated 03.01.2021 to consider the issues raised by the petitioner before the hon'ble high court in the hearing held on 06.12.21. The committee was also asked to consider the written submissions made by the petitioner.
- 5. The committee in its earlier communication had proposed modification in the competencies of Medical Education Curriculum of subject of FMT and Psychiatry. Committee also had suggested to issue an advisory to authors to remove derogatory and unscientific information about LGBTQIA + community and Virginity from medical textbooks.
- 6. As per the expert committees' recommendations advisory (dated 13.10.21) was issued by the NMC regarding issue of LGBTQ community & virginity. After taking note of the said advisory (dated 13.10.21), Hon'ble High Court of Madras on 06.12.21 and 23.12.21 directed the NMC to give serious consideration to the suggestions made by the counsel of the petitioner about the changes in various competencies (i.e., competencies of Forensic Medicine: FM 3.16, FM 3.13, FM 3.17, FM 3.18 and competencies of psychiatric subject PS 13.1 to 13.7).



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- 7. The court also expected that the NMC will modify the competencies of the CBME-curriculum and will make the same operational at least from the next academic year.
- 8. The details of the orders passed by the Hon'ble Madras High Court is as follows:
 - a. Court Order 6.12.21: Para 8 to 11 (page no. 8 to 16):-

Para 9: Court noted the contents of the advisory issued by the NMC to the medical textbook authors about LGBTO and Virginity.

Para 11: Court noted that, the learned counsel appearing on behalf of the Petitioners submitted that the existing competencies of CBME-Curriculum carries offensive and unscientific terms so there is need to amend the said competencies by NMC. Court order also mentions the competencies that needs modification as suggested by the learned counsel appearing on behalf of the Petitioners. The various competencies mentioned in court order are as follows: Forensic Medicine: FM 3.16, FM 3.13, FM 3.17, FM 3.18 and competencies of psychiatric subject PS 13.1 to 13.7. Court order also mentions the suggestions that are needed in the competencies.

In the same para 11 court noted: NMC is directed to give serious consideration to the suggestions made therein (about competencies) and their status report to be filed on the next hearing shall include their justification, if any, on the same.

b. Court order 23.12.21: Para 9 and 10:-

Para 9 (page 10): Court citing earlier court order dated 06.12.21 once again reminded that "While taking note of advisory, this Court pointed out certain vital changes that are required in the CBME curriculum.

Para 10 (page 10): The court noted "This Court expects that the NMC will come up with a finalised version and recommend the changes to be made to the competencies of the CBMEcurriculum. It can be made operational at least from the next academic year"

Thus, court directed to make changes in CBME curriculum and made it operational from the next academic year.

Court further directed to NMC to file a status report in this regard during the next date of hearing.

c. Court order dated 07.06.21:-

Para 43 (H) Page 95: Court directed the NMC to:-

i. Prohibit any attempts to medically "cure" or change the sexual orientation of LGBTIQA+ people to heterosexual or the gender identity of transgender people to cisgender.

take action against the concerned professional involving themselves in any form or method

of conversion "therapy", including withdrawal of license to practice.

conduct sensitization programs about the same as provided by Rule 10(7)(b) of Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Rules, 2020.

d. Court Order dated 04.10.2021:-

Para 11 (Page 9) Court specifically dealt with the wrong notion even among Doctors/ Mental Health professionals that there is a conversion therapy which is available to cure this so called "disease". Court further observed that "This wrong notion has arisen only due to the type of curriculum that is available for the MBBS Course. Court further made it very clear that necessary changes must be brought-in in the curriculum failing which, there will be doctors who will be indulging in conversion therapy with a foolish notion that there is a cure for gender identity/sexual orientation.

- 9. In pursuance to the various orders passed by Hon'ble High Court of Madras, said expert committee meeting was held on 13.01.2022 to discuss the issues raised in the order. In the meeting following members were also present:
 - a. Dr. Aruna V. Vanikar, President, UGMEB, NMC & Observer for the meeting.
 - b. Dr Surabhi Sharma (PT), Senior Consultant, Academic cell, NMC & Secretary for the meeting.
 - c. Ms. Preeti Nanda, Legal Consultant, NMC & Invitee for the meeting.
- 10. On 19.01.2022 another meeting was held in which following members were invited to consider the issues concerned with PG curriculum and Conversion therapy:
 - a. Dr. M.K. Ramesh. President- The Post-Graduate Medical Education Board- NMC.
 - b. Dr. B.N. Gangadhar. President- Medical Assessment & Rating board- NMC.
 - c. Dr Vijay Oza. Member. The Post-Graduate Medical Education Board- NMC.
- 11. In view of the aforementioned court orders, the expert committee constituted by NMC suggested modifications in the competencies (CBME) of Forensic Medicine subject No. FM 3.16, FM 3.13, FM 3.17, FM 3.18 and competencies of psychiatric subject No. PS 13.1 to 13.7) as follows. Table No. A (Note: While studying the curriculum, the committee found that there are other competencies in medical curriculum related to LGBTQIA+ community and other sexual issues which needs changes too. So that are also added in the table).

- 12. Gender identity disorder word is mentioned in the PG competency-based curriculum of subject of Psychiatry. There is need to change the said word to Gender dysphoria.
- 13. Regarding Conversion therapy& high court order:
 - a. The court has specifically directed the NMC to:
 - i. prohibit any attempts to medically "cure" or change the sexual orientation of LGBTIQA+ people to heterosexual or the gender identity of transgender people to cisgender.

- ii. take action against the concerned professional involving themselves in any form or method of conversion "therapy", including withdrawal of license to practice.
- b. The committee is of the view that all Interventions to "change" sexual orientation of a person (commonly referred as Conversion therapy)- Should be banned.

c. Hence, the committee submits that,

- i. To take action against the health professionals for conversion therapy, there is need to make necessary changes in Professional Conduct, Etiquette and Ethics Regulations of NMC and to issue any other instructions/ notification.
- 14. Regarding Conversion therapy & medical curriculum: We searched competency based medical curriculum of NMC for Undergraduate and Postgraduate courses and noted that the word conversion therapy is not mentioned anywhere. However, it appears that while advocating treatment to change" sexual orientation of a person OR gender identity, conversion therapy has been advocated by some medical professionals or other persons.
- 15. Conclusion:- It is submitted that if the necessary changes are brought in the competencies of CBME curriculum, then it will help to remove the derogatory, defamatory and unscientific information about LGBTQIA+ community and Virginity from the medical textbooks.

16. Recommendations:

- a. Modify the competencies of Competency Based Medical Education (CBME) curriculum of Forensic Medicine subject (Competency No. No. FM 3.16, FM 3.13, FM 3.17, FM 3.18, FM 14.14, FM 14.15) and of psychiatric subject (Competency No. PS 13.1 to 13.7) as highlighted in table no. A of this report and accordingly issue the necessary official notification in this regard. (Note: The court expected that the modified competencies of the CBME-curriculum will be operational at least from the next academic year).
- b. Replace the gender identity disorder word used in Competency Based Medical Curriculum of MD psychiatry subject by GENDER DYSPHORIA and accordingly issue necessary official notification in this regard.
- c. Any attempt/ interventions (commonly referred to as Conversion therapy) to "change" sexual orientation of a person to heterosexual shall constitute UNETHICAL CONDUCT on the part of the medical professionals under chapter 6 of the Indian Medical Council (Professional Conduct, Etiquette and Ethics) Regulation, 2002. Hence, issue necessary official notification in this regard.
- d. Any attempt/ interventions (commonly referred to as Conversion therapy) to "change" sexual orientation of a person to heterosexual shall constitute PROFESSIONAL MISCONDUCT on the part of the medical professionals under chapter 7 of the Indian Medical Council

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(Professional Conduct, Etiquette and Ethics) Regulation, 2002. Hence, issue necessary official notification in this regard.

e. In PG Psychiatry Curriculum there is need have module on empathic understanding of psychological issues among LGBTQIA+ groups and an emphasis that any form of conversion therapy is unethical.
